Fund Description

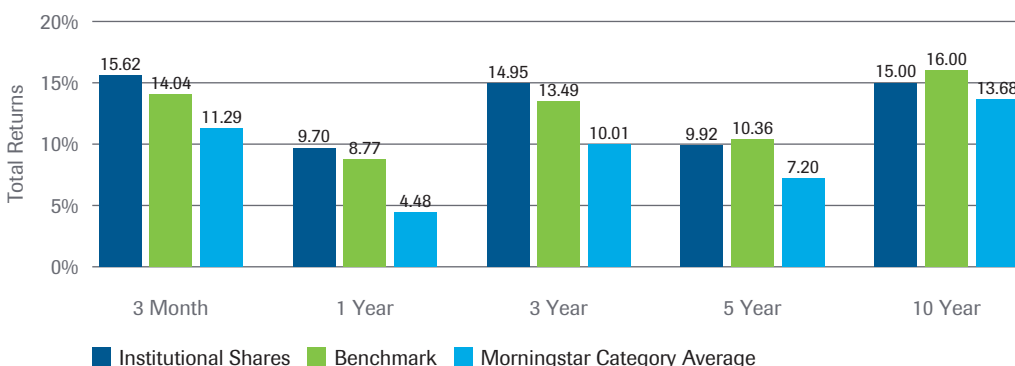
The fund pursues long-term capital appreciation by taking a “whole-market” approach to U.S. stocks and investing in a diversified portfolio of companies from the Russell 3000 Index. Through a fundamentally based, bottom-up, systematic approach, it seeks to remove subjective and emotional influences from the stock-selection process.

All trades are reviewed to ensure they are based on the most recent and accurate information. Insights from pre-trade review provide important feedback to the team and inspire further research.



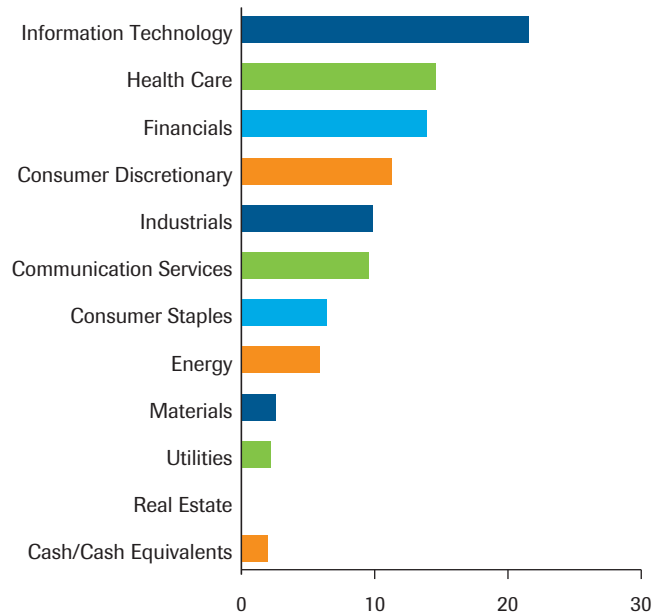

Highlights

- The market favored growth stocks over value stocks
- Strong growth-oriented stocks contributed to outperformance
- Fund ended quarter roughly sector neutral to benchmark except for its Real Estate underweight

Looking Back

The first quarter of 2019 started strong as the market shook off the pall of the volatile fourth quarter. In January 2019, the Russell 3000 Index (R3000) returned 8.58% and the market showed a risk-on appetite with small caps outperforming the large caps (the Russell 2000 Index returned 11.25% in January while the Russell Top 200 Index [RT200] returned 7.48%). In February, the R3000 returned a more modest 3.52% but the small-cap preference did continue as before. By March, however, the R3000 was positive but only at 1.46% and large caps outperformed the small caps. In total, the R3000 returned 14.04% during the quarter, a good performance but not quite enough to make up for the fourth quarter of 2018.

Throughout the quarter, growth beat value consistently in the mid-cap and small-cap ranges. In the large-cap range, growth beat value by 1.64% in January and 2.61% in March, but value did lead the RT200 by a bit in February. As the quarter ended, the Russell 3000 Growth Index returned 16.18% and the Russell 3000 Value Index returned 11.93%, with similar margins in all of the capitalization ranges.

Performance

Federated MDT All Cap Core Fund Institutional Shares returned 15.62% in the first quarter of 2019, outperforming the 14.04% return of its benchmark, the Russell 3000 Index.

- Growth stocks with prices near 52-week highs and very high analyst conviction
- Stocks with high atypical analyst activity, prices near 52-week highs and above-average leverage
- Security selection in Health Care, Information Technology and Communication Services sectors
- Strong performers overweighted by the fund: Xilinx, Inc., Global Payments Inc., Live Nation Entertainment, Inc. and Stryker Corporation

Performance Detractors

- Stocks with favorable growth and value characteristics
- Security selection in Consumer Discretionary sector
- Strong performers underweighted by the fund: Amazon.com, Inc., Microsoft Corporation and Apple Inc.

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How We Are Positioned

The fund ended the first quarter roughly sector-neutral to the benchmark according to the GICS sectors, except for an underweight in Real Estate (the fund does not hold REITs). Within the sectors, there was an overweight position in the insurance and software and services industries. There were underweight positions in the real estate, diversified financials and technology hardware and equipment industries. At the end of the period, the fund was tilted toward growth stocks.

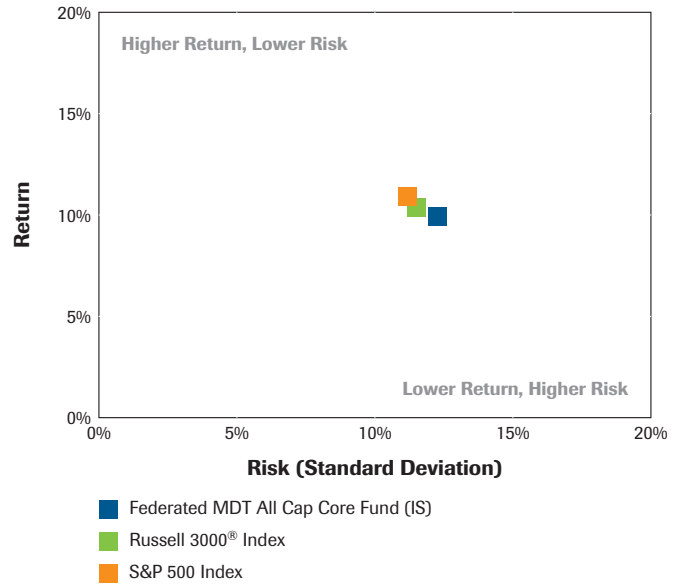

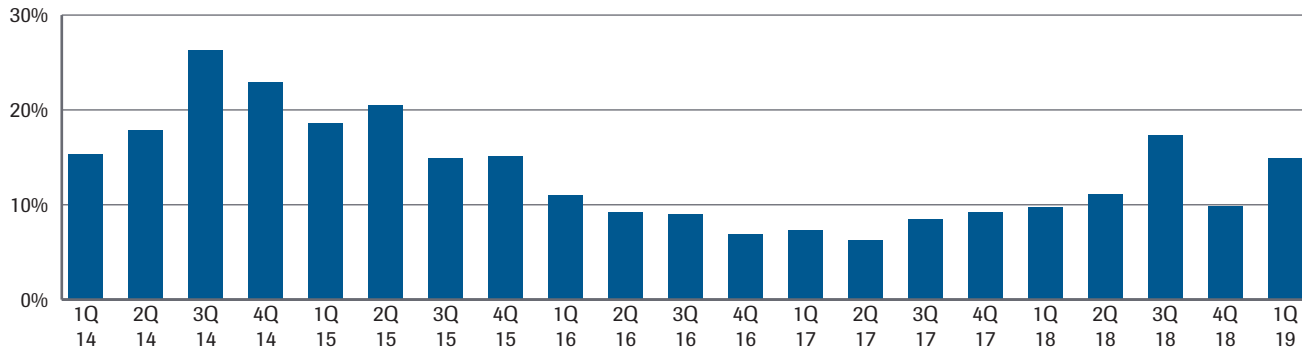

The fund is the successor to MDT All Cap Core Fund pursuant to a reorganization that took place on December 8, 2006. Prior to that date, the fund had no investment operations. Accordingly, the performance information shown for periods prior to that date is that of MDT All Cap Core Fund.

The fund's R Shares, re-designated as R6 Shares on September 1, 2016, commenced operations on December 12, 2006. For the period prior to the commencement of operations of the R Shares (now known as R6 Shares), the performance information shown is for the fund's Institutional Shares, adjusted to reflect the expenses of the R Shares and the performance information for the R6 Shares prior to September 1, 2016 reflects the higher R Shares expenses. Definitions

Russell 3000[®] Index measures the performance of the largest 3000 U.S. companies representing approximately 98% of the investable U.S. equity market. The Russell 3000[®] Index is constructed to provide a comprehensive, unbiased and stable barometer of the broad market and is completely reconstituted annually to ensure new and growing equities are reflected.

S&P 500 Index is an unmanaged capitalization-weighted index of 500 stocks designated to measure performance of the broad domestic economy through changes in the aggregate market value of 500 stocks representing all major industries.

Indexes are unmanaged and cannot be invested in directly.

Alpha shows how much or how little return is generated, given the risk a portfolio takes. A portfolio with an Alpha greater than 0 has earned more than expected given its Beta—meaning the portfolio has generated excess return without increasing risk. A portfolio with a negative Alpha is producing a lower return than would be expected given its risk.

Beta measures a portfolio's volatility relative to the market. A Beta greater than 1.00 suggests the portfolio has historically been more volatile than the market as measured by the fund's benchmark. A Beta less than 1.00 suggests the portfolio has historically had less volatility relative to the market.

Correlation is the degree to which one variable (here, the fund's returns) fluctuates relative to another (the returns of the fund's benchmark). Correlation ranges from 1.00, when two variables move identically in the same direction, to -1.00, when two variables move identically in the opposite direction.

R-Squared indicates what percentage of a portfolio's movement in performance is explained by movement in performance of the market. R-squared ranges from 0 to 100, and a score of 100 suggests that all movements of a portfolio's performance are completely explained by movements in the market as measured by the fund's benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio is calculated by dividing a fund's annualized excess return by the fund's annualized standard deviation. The higher the Sharpe Ratio, the better the fund's historical risk adjusted performance.

Standard Deviation is a historical measure of the variability of returns relative to the average annual return. A higher number indicates higher overall volatility.

Tracking Error is the difference between a portfolio's returns and the benchmark or index it was meant to mimic or beat.

Up Capture Ratio/Down Capture Ratio is a measure of how well a manager was able to replicate or improve on periods of positive benchmark returns, and how badly the manager was affected by periods of negative benchmark returns. The up-market capture ratio is a measure of a manager's performance in up markets relative to the index during the same period. For example, a ratio value of 115 indicates that the manager has outperformed the market index by 15% in periods when the index has risen. The down-market capture ratio is the direct opposite of the up-market capture ratio, gauging performance of the manager relative to the index in down markets. A ratio value of 80 would indicate the manager had declined on 80% as much as the declining overall market, indicating relative outperformance.

Weighted Median Price/Book is a ratio comparing share price to book value or assets minus liabilities.

Weighted Median Market Cap is the calculation representing the median market capitalization of the stocks in the portfolio, weighted by the amount of each stock.

Weighted Median P/E (LTM—Latest 12 Months) is a ratio comparing share price to earnings per share using data from the previous 12 months.

Weighted Median P/E (NTM—Next 12 Months) is a ratio comparing share price to earnings per share using estimated data for the next 12 months.

Ratings and Rating Agencies

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
