

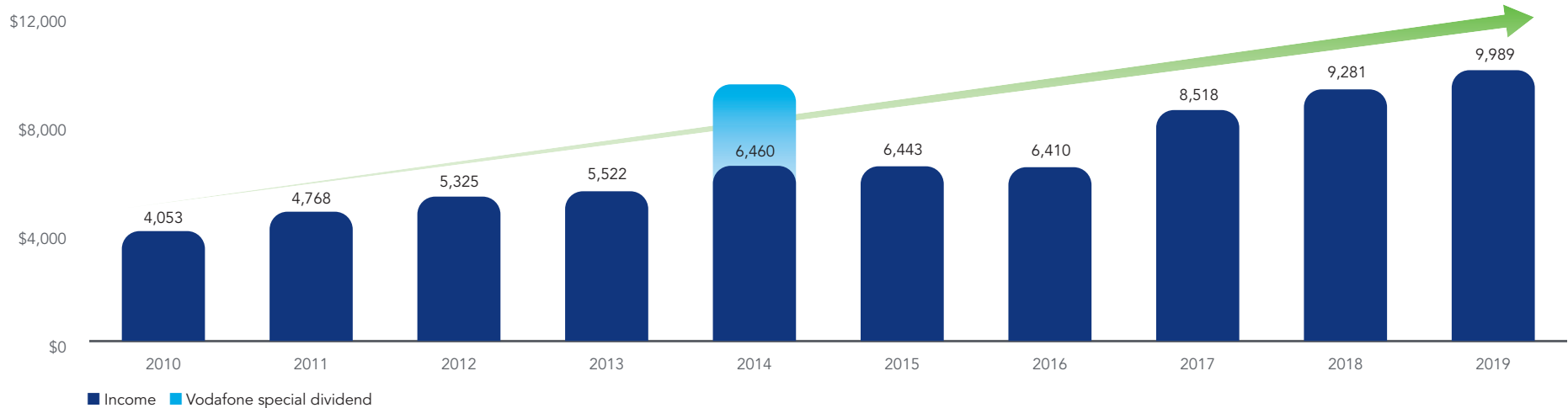
Federated Hermes Strategic Value Dividend Fund

A history of delivering a steady and growing income stream

- The fund targets stocks of companies with long histories of paying and growing their dividends—not simply those with the highest yields.
- Regardless of the economic and market environment, the Federated Hermes Strategic Value Dividend Fund has a long history of delivering dividends and dividend growth.
- Additional special dividends received during this period include: Vodafone in 2011 and 2014; GlaxoSmithKline in 2012 and 2016; National Grid in 2017; and Cracker Barrel Old Country Store in 2019.

30-day yield (also known as "SEC yield") is a compounded and annualized figure calculated according to a formula set by the SEC. The formula requires use of a specific methodology for calculating dividends and interest earned, and expenses accrued, during the period, and reflects the maximum offering price per fund share. The standardized computation is designed to facilitate yield comparisons among different funds. In the absence of temporary expense waivers or reimbursements, the 30-day yield for A Shares would have been 4.09% at NAV, 3.85% at maximum offering price and 4.34% for Institutional Shares.
